Current Pastor Ricardo Granado is called by the LCMS Michigan District to be a Hispanic ministry planter.

The Hispanic immigrants at Pan de Vida have faced immense challenges in their lives. Most of the members at Pan de Vida have fled the social, political and economic crises in their homelands. Many of them even been kidnapped by drug cartels in deserts and jungles as they literally fled for their lives. Immigrants aren't without trouble when they arrive in the U.S. either, unfortunately.

A lot of Hispanic immigrants reach the U.S. with nothing but the challenges they can carry with them. They lack money, transportation, employment, food, clothing, quality housing, basic furniture, toiletries, and barrier you can think of. access to education, some don't even speak any English, and they struggle with just about any other
